Difficult situation in the emergency room

## Consider alternatives before going to the Saint-Eustache Hospital ER

**Saint-Eustache**, **September 24**, **2021** – The Centre intégré de santé et de services sociaux (CISSS) des Laurentides is asking the public to avoid going to the Saint-Eustache Hospital emergency department for non-urgent health issues.

The CISSS des Laurentides would like to remind everyone of the alternatives to going to the ER, to ensure that each person visits the right service, depending on the nature of their problem.

The following options should always be considered, no matter the situation at your local ER:

- Call 811 for Info-Santé to speak with a nurse;
- See your family doctor;
- See a doctor at a walk-in clinic;
- Talk to your pharmacist.

Anyone necessitating urgent care should not hesitate to go to the ER to receive the primary care they need.
